Updated NICE guidance - message from the CCG.

NICE have published updated diabetes monitoring guidance. In-line with all NICE guidance, before implementation the CCG will need to review the impact this will have on our local population. **Until this review has been completed our current formulary positions remain unchanged, including Freestyle Libre requiring specialist initiation (not recommended for initiation in primary care).** A link to the formulary position can be found <u>HERE</u>. Patients are kindly asked not to contact their GP or Specialist Diabetes Teams about this, instead they may discuss with their specialist at their next planned routine appointment.
